He also furnished the materials for a short article on the same subject, which appeared in 'Engineering,' January 1, 1896. There is one difficulty in the use of the new entropy diagram. Properly speaking, it ought only to be applied to reversible cycles, such as are supposed in theory to take place in the cylinders of heat engines.
